The EECS Comm Lab offers writing, speaking, and visual design support for technical communication – papers, presentations, figures, fellowships, faculty application packages, and more. Our staff are trained grad students and postdocs from the department, so they have technical depth as well as honed communication skills.

We're seeking several new members to join our team this spring! EECS-affiliated PhD students and postdocs who plan to be at MIT through at least May 2023 are encouraged to apply to be a Communication Fellow. This position is a great way to help your peers and to develop your own communication skills.

About the Communication Fellowship:

- Fellows will receive a stipend of approximately \$240/month
- Fellows typically contribute 3-5 hrs/week towards Comm Lab related activities
- Fellows receive hands-on training throughout the first year on various communication tasks and best practices in coaching, mentoring, and giving feedback
- Fellows coach peers, develop workshops, create online content, and start innovative initiatives to meet communication needs of the department
- Fellows receive access to exclusive professional development events and 1-on-1 mentorship from the Comm Lab manager
